## BBYC PICYA Delegate notes importance of RBOC, PICYA to California boaters

WE'RE A PART of the larger yachting community as a whole. With a check in hand as approved by the board last month, Ballena Bay showed support for the RBOC at the last PICYA meeting. While the generosity of the club as represented by the board is much appreciated, there is work left to do. These are "interesting" financial times for our state and the RBOC is our front line of defense for the protection of funds for boating in the state as well as other issues pertaining to our enjoyment of the water. Many clubs support the lobbying efforts of RBOC with a first quarter surcharge of \$5 or \$10 per member that is subsequently delivered to the RBOC, an amount that would be approximately 3-6 times above what we have contributed.

This is not intended to be a plea, or even the beginning of a suggestion, of moving in that direction. Instead, it is offered for consideration of scale and as a solicitation of ideas for a fundraiser. We're currently seeking to find a time-frame in which we might have a representative come to the club and speak on some of the past victories and current legislative hurdles facing boaters as the focus of a dinner. A portion of the proceeds might be used for an additional contribution. Other ideas are always welcome here.

I would also encourage every member to visit both the PICYA and RBOC web sites. The PICYA web site often contains a link to a call-to-arms by RBOC providing access to the crucial points of a legislative issue. Additionally, there is usually a vehicle (electronic letter) by which one can make their voices heard in an efficient manner through the group voice associated with the Recreational Boaters of California.

Unfortunately, as of the writing of this sentence, I am unaware of any club entries in the Opening Day on the Bay parade. If any were swayed off by tales of my participation in the soggy Lighted Yacht Parade in December, this parade is in Spring...and weather tends to be a bit warmer, at least, if not drier...and my boat has almost dried out. By publishing time, the parade will have passed. Maybe a flotilla entry next year?

Again, thanks to all members, as well as the current bridge, for the RBOC contribution.
